



Windsor Native Leads Houston Reading Rally Be a Leader – Be a Reader

HOUSTON, Texas – Thirty second graders from Houston’s MacGregor Elementary School recently experienced the 2007 Corporate Reading Rally event, where 10 costumed characters from several companies lent a hand (or paw) to Windsor, Ontario’s Kay Douglas, author, illustrator and Executive Women International (EWI) member, who read to the children in front of 350 EWI members representing numerous cities and businesses throughout the U.S. and Canada.

After Douglas read author Peter Farrelly’s “Abigale the Happy Whale” to the children (as the grown-ups read along on screen), the costumed characters led the children up on stage, where Douglas also read from the Big Red Chair. Then the children were encouraged to ask questions and interact with the characters.

“I loved it when Abigale the whale found all the junk she found in the ocean, carried it on her back and threw it back on the beach,” said 7-year-old student Stephanie Gregory. “I love books with pictures, and I love Abigale because she’s purple.” Gregory wants to be a dentist when she grows up and said she knows that being a good reader is important.

“Encouraging literacy and getting kids excited about reading and learning are incredibly vital. It positions our children for future leadership,” said

Douglas. “Our motto: ‘Be a leader; be a reader’ -- That’s what it’s all about.”

“If you don’t know how to read, your life will be bad,” said 7-year-old student Hayuhel Stringfellow. “You won’t know anything, and you’d make mistakes all the time.” Stringfellow, an aspiring paleontologist, loves books about dinosaurs and practices by digging up bones.

“With the goal of bringing the gift and excitement of reading to all children, EWI hosts Reading Rallies all over the United States and beyond,” said Renea Callery, the EWI member who organized the Houston event. “The Reading Rally is in Houston today, but the experience is duplicated throughout EWI chapters and community volunteers.”

The second graders, accompanied by their teacher, Alisa

Gans, and school principal, Dr. Patricia Allen, said they were delighted to receive a cash donation, in addition to donated books and school supplies from EWI.

“Children love story-telling, and they especially enjoyed being the centre of attention at this unique field trip into imagination,” said Gans. “It wasn’t just a book; it was a message about protecting our environment.”

“Our school is truly honoured with this gift,” said Allen. “We will use the funds for our accelerated reading program in the library.”

Houston hosted the Executive Women International conference, and one of EWI’s philanthropic initiatives is to focus on literacy – a message that is delivered to more than 17,000 children across the country through innovative Reading Rallies that are held by EWI chapters in October each year.

Douglas’ book “Yours for the Dreaming” was released in June. The book encourages creative thinking and a new perspective on reading.

“There is no better gift to give our children than how to hold on to their natural creative ability,” said Douglas. “To carry their creativity into adulthood provides them with the tools to think through difficult challenges, to imagine bigger than they would otherwise, to refuse to settle for what is just because it is.”

EWI Chapters plan and implement their own unique Reading Rally events that range from community read-ins and book donations to major events involving celebrities, story characters and the creation of reading rooms.

The Reading Rally tradition was established in 1999.

EWI is a nonprofit organization of leading business, service and professional companies. It is unique in that the firm is the member, as opposed to the individual. EWI members include 2,683 companies and 3,087 representatives in 73 Chapters in the United States, Canada and Europe.

Veteran Ottawa PR Executive Named to Media Hall of Fame

Ottawa public relations executive Tim Kane has been chosen as one of the first people to be inducted into the

new Algonquin College Media Hall of Fame. Mr. Kane, chairman and CEO of Ottawa-based Delta Media, was a unanimous choice of the selection panel.

Over the years, Tim Kane and his firm have provided scholarships and internship opportunities for students attending Algonquin College, La Cité Collégiale, University of Ottawa and Carleton University in Ottawa and St. Clair College in Windsor. He has also been a tireless supporter of his profession through the International Association of Business Communicators, Canadian Public Relations Society and a host of local, national and international causes. Recently, he spearheaded the revival of the National Press Club of Canada Foundation.

The Algonquin College Media Hall of Fame honours outstanding people for their contributions to media industries in the National Capital Region. Recipients are chosen on the basis of their reputation for excellence, innovation and contributions to the community.

Tim Kane founded Delta Media in 1991 following more than a decade with leading advertisers, advertising and public relations agencies and the Government of Canada. He is a graduate of St. Clair College in Windsor, Ontario, where he was one of that school's first recipients of the Alumni of Distinction Award. In 2000, he was nominated for the Ontario Premier's Award for outstanding contributions to his community and profession and, in 2002, was awarded the Golden Jubilee Medal of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II for his contributions to Canada.

Mr. Kane lives in Ottawa with his wife and business partner, Sheena Pennie.

Future CEO Program Launches in May

St. Clair College is launching a new Business Conference for Young Women called "Future CEO". It's an intense, week-long program in May 2008 that educates female high school students about the development of a business from concept to production in an intense, competitive, team-driven environment.

Six companies of 10 students each from grades 10 and 11 will be mentored by dedicated business volunteers called "executives-on-loan" who serve as Company Advisors, sharing their knowledge, expertise and guidance. Rounding out the experience, the students will be treated to business professionals speaking to them candidly and directly on topics including "Relationship of Business and Government", "Be Your Own Boss", "Unionism" and "Women in Business", just to name a few.

"Future CEO" is not all work and no play! Students will enjoy the experience of spending a week on a college campus; participate in basketball and volleyball games, crazy Olympics, a pool party, ice cream social and visit a large local manufacturing facility.





NEW STUDENT RESIDENCE IN CHATHAM

St. Clair College, in partnership with Residential Development Corp., announced today that it is breaking ground for a new student residence to be located on campus at the corner of Bear Line Road and Grand Avenue.

This is an exciting project for St. Clair College as it is another step in the strategic directions of the College to expand services for students.

“Our vision for the Chatham campus is to see significant growth in

the next three to five years,” says President Dr. John Strasser. “One of the pieces for this growth is the construction of a student residence which will allow us to attract students from outside of the Chatham-Kent market.”

The first residence pod will consist of 12 units and will accommodate 48 students. It will offer the latest amenities including living room/dining area, kitchen, two bathrooms and in-suite laundry facilities.

The project will be built and managed by Residential Development Corp. (RDC), London, Ontario.

Dr. Strasser is pleased with the partnership with RDC. “This company has considerable experience with these types of projects. Their support has been instrumental in helping us move forward with a new student residence.”

The residence is slated to be open for the fall of 2008.




