

## H837 MEDICAL LABORATORY SCIENCE PROGRAM

**Congratulations on entering into Year 2 of the Medical Laboratory Science Program.**

### **Prior to the commencement of classes in September:**

1. Review your Health and Immunization records to ensure your “Passport to Health” is up-to-date. St. Clair College has partnered with **Synergy Gateway Inc** to provide you access to [Verified](#) - a platform that is used by students at other post-secondary institutions across Ontario for the purpose of digitally collecting health requirements related to applied health sciences programs & clinical placement. You digitally uploaded your records and [health assessment record](#) to the Synergy Verified platform for review and clearance in Year 1 Semester 1.

Use [Verified](#) to:

- Review your Year 1 health requirements documentation and ensure it is up-to-date.
  - Track your ongoing requirements compliance.
  - Book your Electronic Requirements Verification (ERV) service at the end of semester 4 to attain clearance for clinical.
2. The Health & Safety Module and Medical Laboratory Program Module must be reviewed and acknowledged on the Medical Laboratory H837 program Blackboard. This is an annual requirement of St. Clair College and the H837 program. It is mandatory and must be completed as soon as possible. There are instructions on how to complete the Health & Safety review, quiz, and documentation.

### Clinical Internship Information

1. There will be information sessions held in Semester 3 and 4 to discuss the Clinical Experience year.
2. During the Clinical year you will pay tuition and the costs for living in your placement area. It is not guaranteed you will be placed in Windsor.
3. Your VSC (vulnerable sector police clearance) and N95 Mask Fit are not required until the semester before your clinical placement. Please do not acquire the clearance for the semester 3 start. You will be advised during the Clinical experience information sessions when to acquire the clearance.
