Around The College

1. If you have been to the Main Campus you might have noticed that the room numbers have changed since your last visit. Here is an explainer of why and how this change has come about. The changes are the result of consultations with local First Responders - Windsor Fire & Police and Windsor-Essex EMS. A full description may be found at https://www.stclaircollege.ca/hub/room-number-updates.

2. St. Clair College teams have taken first and third place places in the Enactus Canada 2024 Regional Competition, beating out dozens of other teams from across Central Canada. Dyssolve, a student project creating processes for purifying greenhouse wastewater runoff and harvesting fertilizer, took first place in two categories. 3. A St. Clair College student team competed in the 19th annual Scotiabank Vanier National Marketing Case Competition in Montreal, QC. The team was made up of Business Administration - Marketing students were highly praised by the judges for their innovative and strategic response to the case study which resulted in a 3rd place win in their division.

4. The College response to the recent financial announcement from the ministry: "While we are grateful for the new funding announced by the ministry, we do hope that it may just be the first step in the renewed support of the post-secondary system. Our past few years of budgetary surpluses will allow us to cope with the temporary reduction of international enrolment during the next two years of the federally authorized "immigration pause". But if immigration restrictions extend beyond that duration, a boost in funding will have to be re-evaluated, especially in the case of colleges in small- and medium-sized population centres."

5. St. Clair College celebrated over 400 graduating students at the 56th Annual Winter Convocation on February 22nd held at the Chrysler Theatre. President France addressed students from the programs from the Schools of Health Sciences, Community Studies, Skilled Trades, Business & IT, and Media Arts and Design who received both diplomas and degrees. The occasion was a memorable day as President France presided over her last convocation as the St. Clair College President.

6. In a venture aimed at fostering gender diversity and inclusion in law enforcement, St. Clair College has collaborated with the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) in its Women Initiative Program. The program, which saw the participation of 11 Police Foundation students from St. Clair College, is designed to provide aspiring female officers with the tools, resources, and support needed to pursue successful careers in policing.

7. The 2024 recipients of St. Clair College's Alumni of Distinction come from diverse backgrounds, but they have all reached great success in their chosen fields. This year's list of honourees will bring a total of 137 graduates recognized by the College since 1992. St. Clair College's 31st Alumni of Distinction Awards recipients are:

Wait a few days for Marilyn to send your info over to the Parking folks, and for them to put your e-mail address on to their Parking database. Marilyn will mail you your membership card. Then follow our new Parking guide for Retirees to access the application online - Requesting-Parking-Permit.pdf /stclaircollege.ca.

Note: You will not be able to access the online parking process if you have not renewed your SCCRA membership for 2024 or if your e-mail address does not match what is currently in the Retiree Association records.

****Please be advised** that some parking permits that were renewed and mailed out in December were not properly completed. They are missing the sticker with the new expiry date (December 2024). If you received one of these in the mail, just bring it in to the Parking Office the next time you are there and the parking staff will take care of it. You do not have to go back outside right away to place it in your car. The parking staff will accommodate you to ensure you are not ticketed that day, and you can place it in your car when you return to your vehicle.

Welcome to Retirement President Patti



You now know her as President Patti France, but she was born Patricia Ann Pollard in Mississauga, Ontario.

Dad was a skilled trades Ford autoworker who worked 16-hour days 7 days a week...(sound familiar?) Mom was a stay-at-home mom who cared for Patti and her three siblings.

Patti has two sisters: one is a social worker and the other a nurse. Her brother is a master electrician. At a point, Dad was transferred to Windsor where he worked at the Essex Engine Plant until he retired.

Patti's early years were spent at Forest Glade Elementary School and Riverside High School. Her education at Riverside included completion of a ten course Business Certificate. This may seem innocuous enough, except that, while visiting St. Clair College to inquire about applying for the Office Administration Program, it was noticed that she could type 120 words a minute. She was then advised there was a part time maternity leave job available and it was offered to her. And so it began.

Patti initially worked afternoons reporting to Marilyn Keemer in the Registrar's Office. She eventually obtained full time employment reporting to Charles Tymchuk and Sue Porter. Up to this point, Patti still had no post-sec-ondary education. But that would soon change.

Shortly after obtaining employment in Scheduling, Patti pursued a Continuing Education Certificate in Computer Programming. This, in turn, led to work as a teaching assistant in the Business Program computer lab, reporting to the late Joe Korchnak, with significant support from people like VP Academic, Gaston Franklyn. During this time, she took additional courses and qualified for a twoyear diploma.

In addition, while all this was going on Patti married and had a baby who is now all grown up and works as a dentist. Ever dedicated to her work, Patti often came in on Saturdays with baby and playpen in tow. She fondly remembers getting babysitting help from Pat McMahon.

Eventually Patti's determination and dedication to her work really paid dividends. After teaching computer courses in both the Business Program and Continuing Education, she was asked to assist with the development for the now defunct MIC courses, which found their way into many of the College's programs. And, as if this wasn't enough of a challenge, she continued to develop herself professionally.

Exclusively part time, she obtained a BA in Adult Education from Brock University. It took ten years, but she did it! This was followed by an MA in Adult Education from St. Francis Xavier University, achieved, incredibly, in just 18 months!

Subsequently, Patti became Supervisor, Learning Resources, during which time she led the development and introduced the College's Academic Interface. The rest is history. During John Strasser's presidency, Patti's leadership and people skills led to her appointment as Vice President, with responsibility for many different portfolios, including Human Resources, Facilities, and Information Technology. She then became Senior Vice President, which added the Academic portfolio.

Given this broad and comprehensive background, it is easy to see how she had become a legitimate candidate for President of our College.

When asked what she considers some of her most significant achievements, she mentions some of the more obvious ones, such as the College's response to the COVID crisis and the expansion of the international student cohort. She is also very proud of the College's many new facilities as well as its responsible financial and resource management, resulting in a substantial sustainability fund, which will see the College through the reduction in the international cohort.

However, she seems especially pleased with the creation of the Centre of Excellence in Academics. St. Clair College is now recognized as a Provincial leader in Academic Excellence.

On a more personal note, Patti spoke most genuinely and sincerely about how grateful she is to the many staff members who nurtured and mentored her over the years. She has publicly acknowledged Joe Korchnak and Bill Totten, but there were many others. She emphasized the need for teamwork and mutual support, and readily acknowledges that this life lesson has influenced her management style, especially with respect to senior administrators.
