Around The College

- 1. For the first time in 25 years, the **St. Clair Saints men's football team** have won the **Canadian Junior Football League National Championships** at the 115th edition of the Canadian Bowl. In front of more than 2,500 in attendance at Acumen Stadium, fans were able to witness history on Nov. 9, 2024, when the Saints Football team became the first ever College team to win the CJFL National Championship.
- 2. Back in September, the city installed string and globe lights along the sides of Ouellette Avenue, which can transition in colour. City Ward 3 Councillor Renaldo Agostino announced that the City of Windsor would be illuminating the downtown streets with **Saints colours along Ouellette Avenue** "We're celebrating the Saints," said Councillor Agostino.
- 3. Dr. Patti France made it her mission to create a space where students could have access to all necessary services in one location. That vision became reality when France's lasting legacy project opened to students, and on Monday, Oct. 28, the **Patti France Welcome Centre** was officially celebrated with a ribbon cutting.
- 4. And, more well-earned recognition On Monday November 25, 2024, at the Sheraton Centre in downtown Toronto, former President **Patti France** was honoured with the **Minister's Lifetime Achievement Award** for her dedication to strengthening St. Clair College, the local community, and the Ontario College system. The Minister's Lifetime Achievement Award is an honour bestowed by the Ministry of Colleges and Universities, reserved for those who have made an enduring difference to the college system.
- 5. Winter is coming, and the **Warm Hands** campaign is well under way to ensure those in need can stay cozy with proper outdoor wear as the temperature drops. The School of MAD (Media, Art & Design) and the SRC have teamed up to collect donations of new or gently used gloves, provided for free to anyone who needs them.
- 6. Forty-one students from **St. Clair College's Police Foundations program** recently volunteered alongside peers from Fanshawe College and Lambton College to participate in a joint "Protest Training" exercise in London, Ontario.
- 7. Hundreds of students and faculty from around the province created a varsity-style setting for this year's **Ontario Colleges' Marketing Competition. Hosted by St. Clair College** on Nov. 14 and 15, the contest attracted participants from 13 colleges for a series of marketing challenges during the two-day event, where St. Clair's team of third-year Business Marketing students collected a few awards.
- 8. Students from the **St. Clair Advertising and Marketing** programs competed in the CRI Global Sustainability Marketing Competition placing **first** as co-winners with "Team Indonesia". This was a global competition with over 1400 students from 120 countries.
- 9.College Employer Council (CEC) and The Ontario Public Service Employees Union (OPSEU) have agreed to enter into binding arbitration with full-time and partial-load professors, instructors, counsellors, and librarians. The parties have mutu-

ually agreed that arbitrator William Kaplan will further mediate and then arbitrate on proposals that remain unresolved.

10. For the second year in a row, St. Clair College has swept the **Esports Canada Post Secondary (ECPS) Canadian Esports Nationals**. St. Clair ultimately captured all six of the ECPS National Championships in Rocket League, Call of Duty, Overwatch, League of Legends, Valorant, and Valorant Game Changers. **

Lea (Simms) Garber Archive Coordinator



One of the longest running and most focussed group of retirees has been a regular Monday morning group known as, (for the want of a more imaginative name), the Archive Group. For over 20 years this dedicated group has met at 9 am every Monday morning from

September to June, collecting, classifying and storing a large mass of historical material related to the origin and growth of St. Clair College.

The coordinator of this group has been **Ms. Lea (Simms)**Garber without whom the activity would not still be in existence today. Lea's background as a Library Technician enabled her to organize a mass of photos, articles, publications, objects, and media that documents College activity dating as far back as the original Western Ontario Institute of Technology (1958 to 1967) and its amalgamation into St. Clair College (1967). Amongst the collection is every issue of the student newspaper until its virtualization; every issue of the Journalism class newspaper; every graduation program; every yearbook; etc. Lea has coordinated the collection and filing of all of these, and many others, documents in order to provide a historical record of College activities.

One of the most ambitious activities was the preparation of chronological information and material used to highlight the College's 50th anniversary in 2017. With Lea's direction and guidance, the College's historical activity was on display at various 50th anniversary events.

The collection, identification and retention of this valuable resource since it inception to today is a result of Lea Garber's guidance and direction. Lea's St. Clair Career as a Library Technician began on August 25, 1969 and continued until she retired from the College in 2003. Shortly after, also in 2003, she became involved with the Retirees' Archive Project where she continued to volunteer in a leadership role up until last year. After more than twenty years of guiding the project, Lea made the decision to retire.

Thank You Lea for all you have contributed to the Retirees' Association, and more importantly, to St. Clair College over the past 20+ years! **

Mark Your Calendars

St. Clair College Retirees' Association 2025 Annual General Meeting Wednesday, May 7, 2025

The purpose of this meeting is to elect officers, approve the 2025 budget, consider bylaw changes, and receive committee reports.

Parking Permits for South & Chatham Campuses 2025

Have you received your 2025 Parking permit yet? Application for "Renewal" for a "2025 New Permit" is an "on-line application".

Here are the steps involved to get this:

- 1. Contact Marilyn Portt to pay your membership. Wait a few days for her to get your info over to the Parking folks and for them to put your email on to their Parking data base. Marilyn will mail you your membership card.
- 2. Complete the application online and submit it. There is a 3-5 day waiting period to process your request.

3. Either pick up your parking pass at the Parking Desk or you can choose the option online to have them mail it to you. When picking it up, the Parking Department staff will require the applicant's email address and verification of paid membership (your membership card) in the SCC Retirees Association for 2024

Note: You will not be able to access the online parking process if you have not renewed your membership for 2025 or if your email address does not match what is currently in the Retiree Association records.

When you go on-line to complete your application for a parking permit, should you require assistance, you can call the following numbers for help:

The Parking Department will allow someone else to pick up the permit or submit a completed application on a retiree's behalf, provided they provide written authorization to the Parking Office at parking@stclaircollege.ca.

Remember - proof of membership is required when picking up your parking permit! You can send her your \$10.00 yearly fee by cheque or e-transfer. If you wish to be a member of OCRA (Ontario College Retirees Association) as well, the fee is \$20 for both.

From the SCCRA 'IT' Department

Chapter 3a - Threats and Pre-paying.

These types of messages can appear via e-mail, snail mail and by telephone – by voice or by messaging.

In all cases, you are 'asked' to purchase X number of gift cards and supply the contact with the card numbers so that the debt or threat can be withdrawn or cancelled.

Pre-paid cards are also used when the 'bank' wants to test for a security flaw.

Be very aware that these threats will be groundless and they only want your money. Once you've supplied the card numbers, the cash is as good as gone.

If the contact claims they're from a known-named service such as your bank or the CRA, and you're not sure, directly contact the service to confirm using the contact info you have on record. Don't rely on an e-mail address or phone number supplied by the contact. It will likely go to their colleague at the next desk.

Chapter 3b - Too Good to be true and Pre-paying.

If you get an e-mail stating that you are the beneficiary of an enormous amount of money especially from a previously unknown relative or the survivor of a random person in a far-off country. (Notably Nigeria or Kenya). To get that payoff, you are first required to pay some sort of advance fee and/or to provide some level of personal financial information. Pay nothing and provide no information. Another trick is to provide an actual name (of a lottery winner, sometimes with a link to an actual story) so if you google it, you'll think it's legit.

Carnival

Carnival is a winter festival celebrated in many cultures around the planet. It occurs in the final few days preceding the solemnly austere season of Lent, the forty-day period of fasting leading up to the celebration of Easter. It is commonly held that the word Carnival comes from the Latin *carnem levare* and *carnelevarium*, meaning *removal of meat*, or from *carne vale* meaning *farewell meat*, referring to the practice in which Catholics observe the 40-day Lenten period of fasting by refraining from drinking alcohol, and from eating meat, milk products, and eggs. *Mardi Gras* (Fat Tuesday) is the last day of Carnival in which traditionally all drink and food that would be given up during Lent would be consumed in one final rush of hedonism.


We remember the following Retirees/Full-time Staff who passed away during the period October 24, 2024 - January 29, 2025
