



- Cost of living is too high to be going to school, food, rent, tuition, transportation, gas (to go back and forth to see family
- More representation in the FRONT of the building
- More signage of directions to the indigenous centre
- Expand our land acknowledgement.
- Indigenize curriculum.
- Find indigenous elders to share history.
- Sharing progress
- Field trips- transportation
- Funding for transportation
- Guided hikes at ONC
- Outdoor Education Centre
- More indigenous research
- Flags of each nation at SCC (sense of familiarity)
- More staff that can have more specific roles.
- Indigenous student handbook
- Highlight the SWAC and ace to finish grade 12 and the transition to post-secondary.
- Hire a staff person that is strictly for helping transition.
- Bring the SWAC program on the first nation.

Where Do We Go From Here?

- Hiring indigenous staff, admin, faculty
- Tina and Muriel assistants, and an indigenous manager to oversee them and their roles.
- Funding for indigenous students should be a higher priority, instead of international students.
- Higher acceptance rates for indigenous students in post secondary programs
- Why so many international students?
- Indigenous Garden and outdoor education area to learn how to harvest medicine and foods trip to Niagara college.

- Indigenous house at the front of the college in the wooded area
- Indigenous programs focus on Indigenous acceptance
- Bring in lacrosse + lacrosse camp.
- Indigenous yoga
- Taking programs back to the nation (help with cost of living)
- Bigger indigenous student council for more student rep and voice to report to IEC.
- More indigenous language around the building

- Land based learning, and outdoor classroom
- Need elders to come and share our culture.
- More hand on learning

- Need to develop our own post secondary facilities, to develop what WE NEED and teach the way that our students need.
